CELEBRATING 50 YEARS OF TRADITIONAL MUSIC AND ART!

In the early seventies a small group of Mt. Pleasant Food Co-Op members and local musicians were staging free concerts and benefits around Big Rapids and Mt. Pleasant. Common sites were city parks and public halls. Proceeds enabled the food co-op to pay rent and utilities, barely. It didn't take long for the group to get organized as Wheatland Music Organization.

Since that time, Wheatland Music has grown and become one of the best outdoor music festivals in Michigan. Starting with one stage, it was soon expanded to include Kids Hill, an area for children to learn about music and art. Wheatland has continued to grow and now has 6 stages, an area for teens and young adults (Middle Ground),

Kids Hill, Folk Instrument instruction area, and Workshop Lane hosting workshops on various subjects.

To commemorate our 50th Anniversary, WMO has commissioned Robert Barnum, a nationally known metal artist, to create a sculpture, pictured above, honoring the different aspects of Wheatland: Music, Dance, and Art. This sculpture, The Magic of Art and Music, will be funded entirely by donations! It is our plan to have it installed by the 50th festival. You can donate several ways: make a donation when you order tickets, call the office and make a donation or go to the WMO Store. We need your help to make this happen!

PERFORMERS

Nic Gareiss & Laurel Premo

One of Dance Magazine's "25 to Watch," dancer, musician, and dance researcher Nic Gareiss (he/they) has been hailed by the New York Times for his "dexterous melding of Irish and Appalachian dance" and called "the most inventive and expressive step dancer on the scene" by the Boston Herald. They reimagine movement as a musical practice, recasting dance as a medium that appeals to both eyes and ears. Born, raised, and residing in Michigan, Gareiss engages many percussive dance traditions, weaving together a singular dance practice marked by his love of clog, flatfoot, and step dance footwork vocabulary; improvisation; and musical collaboration.

Laurel Premo is known for her rhythmically deep and rapt delivery of roots music, voiced on finger-style electric guitar, lap steel, fiddle, and voice. The glowing heartiness and rich grit of her sound reveal a love of and complete submersion in heavy archaic roots—from the crossover of old-time and blues American traditions to darker Nordic sounds. She is a Michigan-based artist who has been writing, arranging, and touring since 2009 with vocal and instrumental roots acts, and is internationally known from her duo Red Tail Ring.

In this duo collaboration, multi-instrumentalist and singer Laurel Premo and dancer, singer, and musician Nic Gareiss partner to wade deep in archival repertoire, new composition, and extemporaneous encounter using fiddle, electric guitar, voices, and percussive dance.

Arts Weekend 2023

Roochie Toochie and the Ragtime Shepherd Kings

After forming in 2013 to fulfill their shared dream of recording an entire album on wax cylinder, Roochie Toochie transformed their recorded repertoire of antique novelty tunes into a fantastic stage show that puts a capital “S” in showmanship. When you see the Ragtime Shepherd Kings, you’ll witness: fancy fiddling, dueling Hawaiian guitars, ukulele wizardry, flashy lap steel guitar, a menagerie of toy instruments, vocal harmonies that sound as if they were polished by hand, a musical pig “porkestra, and scandalous dancing—and that’s just the Intermission!

Members of Roochie Toochie are Timmy Findlen (ukulele, vocals), Lindsay McCaw (fiddle, banjo, guitar, Hawaiian guitar, vocals), Matt Bell (guitar), Joy Patterson (percussion, vocals) and Joel Jackson (guitar, steel guitar).

Steam Machine

Steam Machine is a Midwest-based bluegrass accompanied Old Time music project fronted by award-winning, in-demand Minneapolis fiddler AJ Srubas, and Twin Cities Old Time music and dance instigator Rina Rossi. Other musicians who will be part of Steam Machine at TAW are Twin Cities banjo whiz David Robinson, and one of the most provocative, significant, and capable voices in the North American traditional music scene, Nokosee Fields (bass).

While not purists, Steam Machine does listen closely to the “old stuff” and strives to capture the essence of what makes these tunes and songs special. Equally at home playing for an Old Time/bluegrass-loving crowd or listeners new to these sounds, Steam Machine aspires to keep Midwest-style Old Time bluegrass music alive and well.

Wild Honey Collective

The Wild Honey Collective formed in the summer of 2020 to perform original songs and traditional American folk music. Singers and songwriters Tommy McCord, Danielle Gyger, Timmy Rodriguez and Dan O’Brien, joined shortly thereafter by pedal steel guitarist Adam Aymor (plus Joel Kuiper on drums at TAW) launched the project in rural Michigan as a back porch acoustic gathering, purely for the love of music, in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Ever evolving, the Wild Honey Collective encompasses sounds of traditional string band music, rowdy country rock, psychedelia, classic pop and more, to preserve and nurture the lineage of Cosmic American Music.

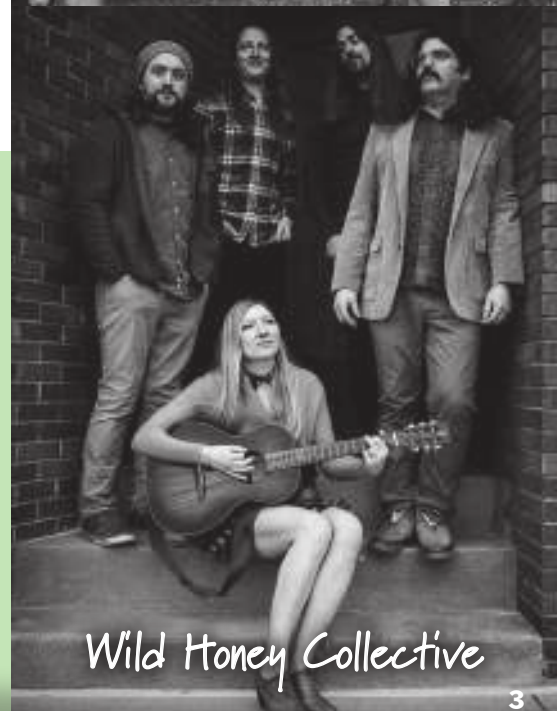

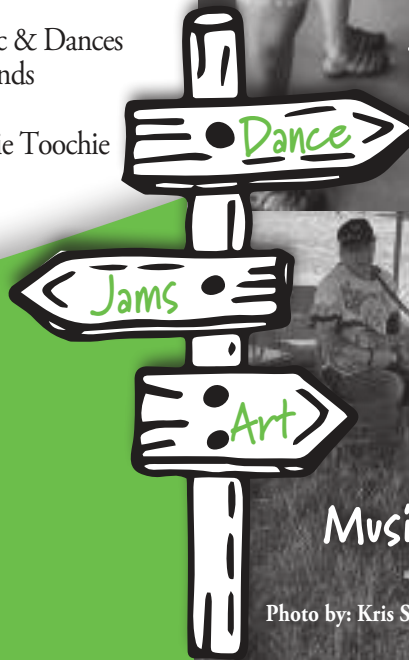

Food will be served Friday evening through Sunday evening. This year there will be two food trucks; no food will be served in the building.

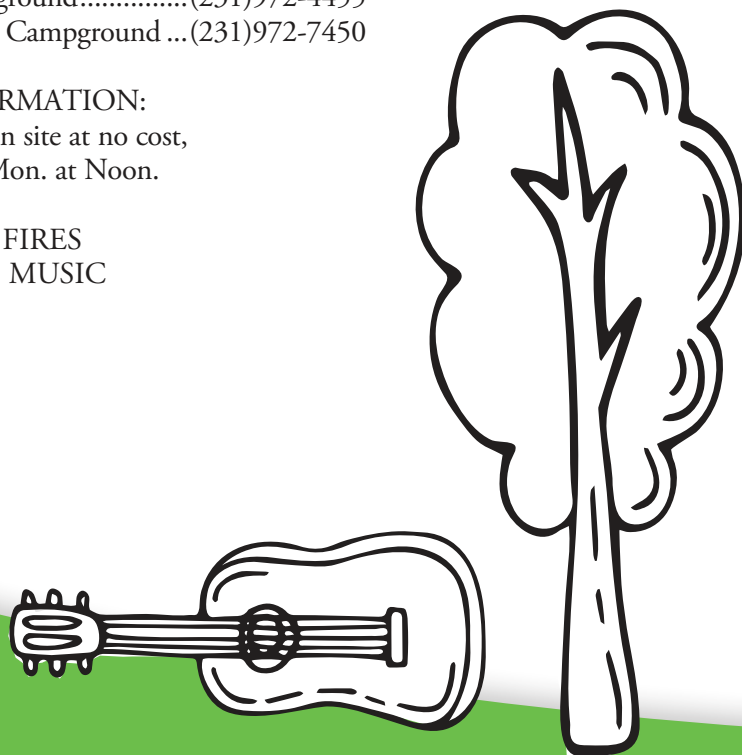

About Summer Wheat Music Camp

Make memories to last a lifetime at the Summer Wheat Music Camp this June. Come to the beautiful Wheatland Festival site for a week of jamming, learning, and dancing. Come as a camp attendee for a week, a few days, or a day. We also welcome the public to visit for evening entertainment and dinner.

Featuring a lineup of internationally and nationally renowned award-winning instructors, Summer Wheat is dedicated to providing an immersive musical and educational experience for those looking to enhance their current skills and/or build a solid foundation in a new area.

Students will be inspired by daily performances, receive coaching, and see the inner workings of their collaborative creative process. Participants develop skills in one-on-one sessions and in small group lessons.

Beginner through advanced music instruction includes lap dulcimer, hammer dulcimer, fiddle, guitar, singing, songwriting, mandolin, upright bass, harmonica, and ukulele. Other offerings include Tai Chi, storytelling, performance techniques, and music theory.

Musical styles include Irish, Old Time, Americana, Blues, and Cajun and classes include instrumental, songwriting, and singing lessons. Summer Wheat aligns with the mission of Wheatland Music Organization and calls attention to both the preservation and presentation of traditional music.

Tuition includes all meals and snacks, beverages, on-site camping, hot shower facilities, evening dances and performances, and, of course, instruction. Participants can enjoy moving in the daily Tai Chi class and go for nature walks in the beauty of the rolling hills, meadows, and woods.

There's a jam or two every night; some are slow, some fast, and some around the campfire. Impromptu jams also spontaneously pop up throughout the day.

Evening performances and dances include a Honkey Tonk Showcase and Dance, an Irish Pub Session, a Sing Along, Cowboy Campfires, and a Cajun Dance with Creole Du Nord. Fun Night lets students take to the stage to share jokes, skits, poems, comedy, and more. The Student Showcase allows students to share what they have learned at camp in a wildly supportive environment that ends the last night of camp on a positive note.

On Sunday morning participants enjoy a Father's Day Brunch and socialize before departing.

Traditional arts are learned person to person, passed from one generation to the next. Celebrate the traditions that are at the heart of Wheatland and enjoy a friendly and welcoming community in a safe and accepting environment that is committed to creative fun.
