A new feature of TAW this year will be that there is no pre-registration for workshops. For workshops with limited participation, people may gather at the workshop area 10 minutes prior to the start time. When the number of participants has been reached, the workshop will be closed.



Mark your calendars for Summer Wheat, June 17th through the 22nd. Summer Wheat offers five full days of fun, music and dance instruction, concerts, and delicious food on the Wheatland grounds. Enjoy staying on the beautiful 160-acre festival grounds where the Wheatland Music Festival takes place in Remus, Michigan where you will find rolling hills, meadows, and wooded areas.

With a focus on traditional music, participants develop their skills in one-on-one sessions and in small group lessons. Students can learn from the best of the best in today's traditional music scene. Classes include lap dulcimer, hammer dulcimer, fiddle, guitar, singing, songwriting, mandolin, banjo, upright bass, harmonica, and ukulele. Performance skills and sound 101 will also be available to attendees. Students will be inspired by daily performances, receive coaching, and see the inner workings of their collaborative creative process.

Summer Wheat is open to adults of all ages and young folks able to sustain an adult level of participation (parent or guardian required for those under 18). There is a discounted option for non-musical spouses, partners, and parents to join the fun.
